

Standardization:

- Plain Language/Terms
- Titles to distinguish Emergency Operations from Daily Operations
- Operational Periods

Command:

- A. Establishing and transfer of command
- B. Chain of command and unity of command
- C. Unified command

Planning/ Organizational Structure:

- A. Management by Objective
- B. Modular Organization
- C. Incident Action Plans
- D. Span of Control



- C. Liaison Office





- Monitor daily critical briefs
- Review Weekly outlook
- Pass along weekly report with a summary of highlights to CEO and SVP (NOAA report only).
- Provide daily briefing where there are hazards/ concerns with recommendations on actions we should take.
